Here are some statistics I think you will find interesting.

15% of students in the southern part of Lake County, IN qualify for free and reduced lunch. That is 4% higher than the national average.

The Federal Poverty Guidelines for 2023 are: Family of four \$30,000. Family of five \$35,140. Family of six \$40,280.

(Some assistance programs do allow for adjustments above these guidelines.) Ask yourself how that compares to your income.
