Lenten Household Pantry Challenge

Lent is a season of sacrifice. People often give up something they like to do or eat or drink.

During Lent 2024, beginning Ash Wednesday, February 14th through Easter Sunday, March 31st, we are challenging the supporters of Community Help Network to a different kind of sacrifice.

As you may or may not know, low-income families cannot use their SNAP benefits (aka Food Stamps), to purchase paper products, hygiene items or cleaning supplies.

These are exactly the items we offer families in our Household Pantry, which is currently serving about one hundred families each month.

We are challenging you to collect one of these items listed below each day, as possible, through the Lenten period.

We would then like you to deliver them to our warehouse location, 550 East Burrell Drive, Crown Point (red door by the loading dock), the week of April 1st between the hours of 10:00 am until 3:00 pm Monday through Friday and Saturday 9:00 am until Noon. If this is not possible or convenient, you may bring items during pantry hours: Tuesdays and Saturdays between 9:00 am and Noon or Wednesdays 5:00 pm until 7:00 pm.

Items Needed

All-purpose cleaner, dish soap, laundry pods, fabric softener sheets, hand soap, bars of soap or body wash, shampoo, deodorant, hand or body lotion, hand sanitizer, disposable razors, toothpaste, toothbrushes, feminine supplies, diapers, baby wipes, adult diapers, adult wipes, toilet paper, paper towels.

Ruth is a vital member of the Community Help Network Board. Ruth closely monitors the nutritional values of the Buddy Bag contents. She works together with the board to make improvements whenever and wherever possible.

We also survey Buddy Bag parents to see how we might improve the contents include in the bag.

Our recent survey revealed that the cans of tuna were not being well received. We have switched pouches of chicken for the tuna and will be surveying the parents again at the Annual Family Fun Fair in June.

At the beginning of the school year, a trial was started with the Foodbank of NWI. During the almost four-month trial, the Foodbank was able to provide CHN with food for Buddy Bags as ordered, delivered to the warehouse and at a competitive price. With the positive results, the board made the decision to enter into a partnership agreement. As a result of the partnership, the menu has been changed to include chicken in packs, a juice pack, and bear grahams. We are hopeful the students will enjoy the changes, which also result in a lighter bag.
